*Faculty Member University of California at Berkeley and at Santa Cruz*

### **Topic: “The Tri-band Antenna”**

In preliminary remarks, Ed discussed the EE education curriculum currently in place. He then showed the current version of his tri-band antenna for use on the 70 cm, 1.5 m and 2 m bands and the respective SWRs of 1.0, 1.0 and 1.1. Noting that there are many copycats of his prior 2-band antenna and that none of them work very well, he then proceeded to discuss various 2-band J-pole configurations and how, from those designs, he developed the current tri-band.

## SPECS UG Business Meeting

### Board Member's Reports:

Secretary: reviewed last meeting's minutes and asked that they be accepted. A motion to accept was made and seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer: presented the Activity, Balance Sheet and P&L for 2017 (see appendix). He noted there has been declining revenue from The Flea Market activities and issues surrounding use of De Anza College facilities as the site. A motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was made and seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

1<sup>st</sup> VP: followed up on Patrick's comments and responded to Ed Fong's comments about the possible use of Fry's parking lot for upcoming Flea Markets.

2<sup>nd</sup> VP: the 2017 annual meeting is underway.

Training Officer: there have been no training issues.

### Other Reports:

Phil Henderson, KF6ZSQ, gave a short report describing the Hospital Net, its purpose, how it is structured, and how it functions. He noted that if one is interested in working on the net, one should check with their city EC. El Camino Hospital provides space and equipment, along with antenna drops for operation of the net. In response to questions, he noted that there is no planned support for medical clinics. Paul Goldstein noted that in any real emergency the Kaiser clinic in Mountain View will be shut down. Other clinics probably will be, too. Lea Roberts commented that in such an emergency situation, a Hospital Net radio operator must be prepared to be active over several days.

---

Dave Platt presented an update on the W6ASH Repeaters. He noted that there will be two new antennas on the new hospital building for the repeaters which will be linked and tied in with the Santa Clara County resource net. Current codes are available for functions of the repeaters such as “646” which provides a transmission test response. These codes are available to SPECS members and can be obtained from Dave. Some movement on the interference issue has been made: the source has finally been identified as equipment on an adjacent microwave tower and work with the equipment owner is progressing. The problem can be mitigated somewhat by moving to an alternate antenna and turning off the PL. The W6ASH 440 repeater is now linked with the SCC resource net. Dave noted that El Camino Hospital has been very supportive of all of our activities.

# Minutes of the Annual Meeting – January 20, 2018

---

- Income from the SPECS Flea Market Saturday 08 April 2017 at De Anza College was seriously impacted by rain, resulting in far fewer sellers than the number required to break even from gate receipts. SPECS Users Group collected \$1,035.00 from only 34 sellers.
- The amount collected in 2017 was \$1,365.00 less than the \$2,400.00 fee paid by SPECS Users Group to the Association of Silicon Valley Amateur Radio Organizations (ASVARO).
- Fortunately, ASVARO still had a Rainout Protection Fund that covered this shortfall of \$1,365.00.
- Note that the two rainy flea markets (March 2016 and April 2017) nearly exhausted ASVARO's Rainout Protection Fund.

Payment to the SPECS Repeater Association in 2017 was \$364.17, the usual transfer of ½ of Flea Market profit.

SPECS Users Group had 132 dues-paying members in 2017. 72% indicated that they were ARRL members.
