Treasurer's Comments

Jim Weatherford, WU6K

In 2023 we were able to hold an in-person annual meeting for the first time since the pandemic, although food and drink were not allowed so we did not incur refreshment expenses as we usually would. We were also glad to be able to host an Electronics Flea Market in June resulting in \$1,778 net income after expenses and sales taxes due.

As of October 31, 2023, our assets are \$38,697.26 compared with \$37,214.80 last year. Our main expenses aside from the flea market were D&O insurance (\$200), Meetup (\$168.20), new Post Office box (\$115), and tax/registration filings (\$85). We had \$235 gross membership fee income this calendar year and \$16.68 in transaction fees, for a net income of \$218.32.

Our assets are held in two Bank of America checking accounts (\$16,816.33 and \$6,337.04), and two B of A CDs (\$10,365.66 and \$5,178.23).

The SPECS Users Group currently has 76 paid-up members, of which 10 are new for 2023. 41 people who were members in previous years did not renew for 2023.

Secretary's Comments

The SPECS Users Group board met five times in 2023, via Zoom. In February we explored ideas to improve outreach, such as using Meetup. In April we began plans for the Electronic Flea Market, to be held in June. The SPECSRA reported that the

installation of the W6ASH repeaters at the new location at El Camino Hospital was complete. Stiv Ostenberg, our Community Outreach Officer, played a major role in organizing and promoting the Flea Market this year and created a "how to" document to help next year's organizers plan. In July the board decided to switch to an "Anytime Mailbox" since costs had gone up for the box in Mountain View. The September meeting focused on plans for the Annual Meeting,

The W6ASH repeater system has spent all of 2023 in its new home, in the penthouse of the Sobrato Pavilion at El Camino Hospital. All three repeaters are operational, using the new antennas purchased for the installation. The linking feature for the Resource and Travel net has been used successfully in support

of several training and public-service events this year.

We had one short-term failure of the 2-meter repeater, caused by a faulty audio connecting cable. The cable has been repaired, and a complete refurbishment of the system cabling is being planned.
